



2009/2012**

In case of acceding to the position which I am proposed for, I will demonstrate the aptitude and will to improve with prudence the procedural operations of the Committee and in general comments, taking advantage of the experience of the people already integrated into the organization, and committing myself to the search for compromise in the spirit of team work. I will give the Committee maximum priority in regard to the academic activities I am involved with, on the understanding that the purpose of the Committee is to help States better fulfill its obligations according to the Covenant.

The Committee, like the rest of the bodies of human rights protection in the United Nations, should be capable of rising to the situations and challenges that confront the international community such as the debates over optimization of operations and possible unification of methodologies, which require a scrutinizing analysis, the results of which must maintain the standards already encoded.

The dialogue with civil society is also of great importance. It should remain as open as it has been, and be incorporated further into the organization of various committees within the marks settled down in the Consultative Statute and the other rules of operation of the United Nations.

I will support the inter-committee meetings and the expansion of works in conjunction with their directive bodies, and will develop my duties in harmony with the High Commissioner for the Human rights and the Human Rights Council, with impartiality and professionalism.
