**Communication from the Congress of National Minorities of Azerbaijan to the United Nations, the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), the Council of Europe, the Department of State and the Congress of the United States of America, the French Parliament, and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the State Duma of the Russian Federation**

We, the participants of the Congress of National Minorities of Azerbaijan, express our profound indignation at and strong protest against the so-called “constitutional referendum” which took place in the Nagorno-Karabakh region of the Republic of Azerbaijan on 10 December 2006. This is another defiant provocation staged by the Republic of Armenia and the military occupation regime in a territory that legally belongs to our country.

The separatists have deliberately carried out this objectionable act, which contradicts not only the Constitution of Azerbaijan but also the relevant norms and principles of international law. It is precisely for this reason that the “referendum” will have no legal effect whatever, and its results will be deemed a priori invalid. We are convinced that Armenia, which is officially recognized as an aggressor State, will once again fail in its attempt to mislead the international community, which has ample information about the monstrous policy of ethnic cleansing carried out by Armenia against the peoples of Azerbaijan. As a result, 20 per cent of the territory of Azerbaijan is today under occupation, and more than 1 million Azerbaijanis, Russians, Kurds and persons of other nationalities have become refugees. This policy of genocide has turned Armenia into a mono-ethnic State, with all the associated consequences.

For centuries, representatives of dozens of nations and peoples have lived in peace and harmony in Azerbaijan. Together with Azerbaijanis, they have shared joy and sorrow; in times of trial, they have taken up arms and given their lives to defend the freedom and territorial integrity of Azerbaijan, which is their genuine homeland. Because the national minorities are self-sufficient, they have never felt disadvantaged in any way, and today they enjoy all the rights accorded to citizens of a sovereign and democratic country, while preserving and developing their culture, language and traditions. This was made possible through the sound national policy which was consistently implemented by the national leader Heydar Aliyev, and which is being successfully continued by his successor, President Ilham Aliyev. It is he who is now the firm guarantor of respect for the rights and freedoms of all the country’s citizens, irrespective of nationality or creed.

The Armenian people who were resettled in the highland part of Karabakh two centuries ago are citizens of Azerbaijan who have always enjoyed equal rights with the rest of the population.

Armenian schools were functioning in Nagorno-Karabakh, the territory had its own theatre and higher education institution, and Armenians held senior leadership positions and State posts.

However, it is clear that some forces found it advantageous to destroy the inter-ethnic peace and harmony in Azerbaijan and to sow the seeds of discord.

The Congress of National Minorities of Azerbaijan takes this opportunity to declare its full support for the efforts of the Azerbaijani leadership to resolve the Armenian-Azerbaijani conflict relating to Nagorno-Karabakh on the basis of international law. President Ilham Aliyev has repeatedly declared his willingness to grant Nagorno-Karabakh the utmost autonomy, provided that the territorial integrity of Azerbaijan is preserved. However, the policy and actions of the national separatists are aimed at disrupting the peace talks, as demonstrated clearly by the so-called “constitutional referendum” that was announced.

Similar actions by those who are attempting to undermine the peace process run counter to generally accepted democratic standards and values, the rule of law and human rights.

The Congress of National Minorities of Azerbaijan calls on the United Nations, OSCE, the Council of Europe, the Department of State and the Congress of the United States of America, the French Parliament, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the State Duma of the Russian Federation, and the whole international community to condemn this illegal act, to refuse to recognize the results of the so-called referendum and to firmly support efforts to find ways of resolving this long-standing conflict in compliance with the principle of the territorial integrity of Azerbaijan, in order to achieve sustainable peace and stability in the region.
