**Statement of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic
of Azerbaijan**

The Republic of Azerbaijan welcomes the principled and unequivocal position clearly expressed by the international community with regard to the so-called "presidential elections" held in the occupied territories of the Republic of Azerbaijan on 19 July 2007. By reaffirming its unswerving respect for the territorial integrity of Azerbaijan and rejecting these illegal "elections", the international community has given a clear message to those who try to capitalize on the suffering of the displaced Azerbaijani population. Azerbaijan shares the concerns of its international partners about the negative effect of the illegal "elections" on the ongoing peace process.

Another attempt by the Republic of Armenia to camouflage its annexation policy and occupation of the territories of Azerbaijan ended in a complete and unavoidable failure. By its deeds, the Armenian side misleads no one but its own society. The international community is well aware of the situation in the occupied territories of Azerbaijan.

The Republic of Azerbaijan shall never accept a solution based on a fait accompli, which the Armenian side is trying to impose. The conflict in and around the Nagorno-Karabakh region of Azerbaijan can be solved only on the basis of respect for the territorial integrity and inviolability of the internationally recognized borders of Azerbaijan and the peaceful coexistence of the Armenian and Azerbaijani communities in the Nagorno-Karabakh region within Azerbaijan, enjoying the benefits of democracy and prosperity fully and equally.

Azerbaijan expects that after Saint Petersburg's failure to accept the relevant proposals of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe Minsk Group Co-Chairmen, the Armenian side will reconsider its approach and take a constructive course.

Azerbaijan once again calls on the Armenian side to cease its destructive policies and, instead of wasting precious time, to negotiate in good faith with a view to finding a durable solution to the conflict as soon as possible.
