Annex

Explanatory memorandum

The ongoing conflict in and around the Nagorny Karabakh region of the Republic of Azerbaijan has resulted in the occupation of a significant part of Azerbaijan's territory and the expulsion of a large portion of its population and severe damage to the national economy.

The Security Council has adopted four resolutions — 822 (1993), 853 (1993), 874 (1993) and 884 (1993) — demanding the immediate, complete and unconditional withdrawal of the occupying forces from the occupied territories of Azerbaijan and the creation of necessary conditions for the return of displaced persons to their homes in security and dignity. Those provisions of the resolutions remain unimplemented.

The process for the peaceful settlement of the conflict on the basis of the norms and principles of international law is carried out under the auspices of the OSCE Minsk Group, but as yet no result has been achieved.

In the meantime, illegal activities are currently being carried out in the occupied territories of the Republic of Azerbaijan, in particular by transfer of settlers in order to create artificially a new demographic situation in those territories.

In view of the far-reaching implications of such activities, which constitute dangerous developments in the conflict and have a devastating impact on the negotiations, it is incumbent upon the General Assembly to deal with the question in all its aspects with a view to taking appropriate action to cease the occupation and reverse the illegal activities.
