STATEMENT BY MR. NEMUUN GAL 3RD SECRETARY, PERMANENT MISSION OF MONGOLIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS

15 September 2004

Mr. President,

Upon the instructions from my Government I wish to reiterate its official position on the issue under consideration. It is well known that by its resolution 2758 (XXVI) of 25 October 1971, the General Assembly has restored the lawful rights of the People's Republic of China, and has settled the issue of the representation of the Chinese people and Government in the United Nations. Therefore, the inclusion of the proposed item in the agenda of the General Assembly will contradict to the principled decision taken by the General Assembly back in 1971.

The General Committee of the General Assembly at its previous sessions has refused to include this item in the agenda of the General Assembly. Like many others, we believe that there is no compelling reason for it to be included in the agenda of this session of the General Assembly.
