National President,

Past Presidents and other Executives, Distinguished Ladies of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Good afternoon.

I have the honour of bringing warm greetings on behalf of His Excellency Brian Wallace, Permanent Representative of Jamaica to the United Nations, who is regrettably unable to join you on this auspicious occasion due to a prior commitment. It therefore falls to me to extend a very warm welcome once again to the United Nations.

At the outset, I wish to congratulate the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority on the 20th anniversary of its Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council. When I arrived at the Permanent Mission in 2013 as Counsellor, "Delta Days at the United Nations" was one of the activities under my portfolio. It, therefore, gives me great pleasure to join in the commemoration of this significant milestone, as well as the stock taking of the meaningful contributions and global impact, a decade later.

The theme for the 20th anniversary, "Forward with Fortitude", is most fitting. As a proud graduate of Kingston College in Jamaica, "fortitude" is a concept which resonates very deeply. We were taught, as young men, to live by the motto: *fortis cadere cedere non potest; the brave may fall but never yield.* In a time where humanity is faced with much adversity – a pandemic, the scourge of war, the existential crisis of climate change – fortitude is not only necessary, it is critical.

NGOs with special consultative status with the ECOSOC, like Delta Sigma Theta, play a particularly important role by informing the decision-making of member states towards ensuring a people-centred, inclusive and just approach to solving global issues.

On the part of Jamaica, the achievement of gender equality; women's full, equal and meaningful participation; the empowerment of women and girls in all spheres; and the elimination of racial discrimination is paramount in all multilateral fora. To this end, we salute the work of Delta Sigma Theta and encourage you to remain steadfast in your social action and partnership towards empowering the present and future generation of women and girls, and our global family as a whole.

As you take this opportunity to celebrate how far you have come, together, it is my sincere hope that you will continue to forge ahead with vigor and vitality, and never yield to the challenges come what may.
